**\*\* Heteronyms:**

sake ("SAYk") Please do it for my sake.  
 sake ("SAH kay") The Japanese make a wine called *sake* out of rice.

\*\* The "k" sound in words that came into our language from the Greek are usually spelled with a "ch." These words usually are either religious words such as **Christ** (K-ryh'st) or medical terms such **ache** and **chronic**. See pp. 905-908 in *The Patterns of English Spelling* for complete listing of words in which the "k" sound is spelled ch.
